



Forty members of the Discovering Nottingham group enjoyed a tour from the General Hospital, situated on The Ropewalk, down to Brewhouse Yard. We learnt about the history of the General Hospital and then viewed plaques commemorating Byron's stay at 76 St James Street and where King Charles I raised the Royal Standard at the commencement of the Civil War in 1642. En route to the Castle we saw Memorial House, the Nurses Home and after hearing of some of the Castle's history we proceeded to the iconic statue of Robin Hood. Marshall Tallart, the defeated French Commander who was responsible for introducing celery to the United Kingdom, was detained at Newdigate House on Castle Gate. The church of St. Nicholas, viewed from Castle Gate, was used by the Royalists during the Civil War. A short walk past the medieval Severns building on Castle Road and down to the Trip to Jerusalem and Brewhouse Yard ended the interesting and informative tour. *Barbara Gani*

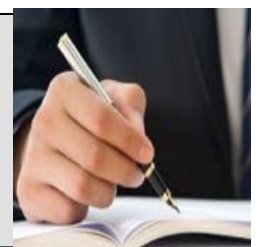

The Geology group had an educational visit to the National Stone Centre at Wirksworth. Gerry the centre manager (blue top in photo) led us on a tour around the site.

This included the rock strata in the quarry, fossil Crinoids on the exposed limestone and an interesting dry stone wall comprising of 19 sections of different stone from across the UK.
